Subject: Accessing student data with the new student information system

RE: Student Information Reporting: Accessing student data with the new student information system

Any faculty, staff or administrators who request data reports from IMS, OASIS or other legacy systems that contain student information should be aware that there will be a new process for requesting and accessing data with the implementation of the new Student Information System. This will include data requested from the offices of Undergraduate Admissions, Graduate Admissions, Financial Aid, the Registrar, the Bursar, Student Accounts, Curriculum Systems and Institutional Research.

UGA is in the process of implementing a new student information system that will replace the multiple aging legacy systems and databases, including IMS and OASIS, with a modern and sustainable technology platform. The new system, which includes the deployment of new Banner software and student data reporting tools, will allow one central location for student data.

To prepare for the transition to the new system, members of the ConnectUGA Reporting Team will hold an information session for anyone on campus who routinely requests student data and reports. The information session for **Student Information Reporting** will be held **Monday, September 30, 10:30-12, Masters Hall, Georgia Center for Continuing Education**. This session will be of interest to persons in schools, colleges and units across campus who work in the areas of academic affairs, student affairs, development, alumni relations, international education and athletics who request high-level student data for respective business processes. Academic advisors, office managers, information technology professionals, directors, faculty, staff and anyone who requests student data will find this session useful. Please encourage anyone involved in requesting and using student data to attend.

Information covered in the session will include a brief overview of the new reporting technology, timeline for requesting reports, demonstration of the reporting tool Argos, and new procedures for requesting and accessing reports from the new student information system.
