Subject: FY 2014 Tuition, Mandatory Student Fees, Housing & Food Service Rates

RE: FY 2014 Tuition, Mandatory Student Fees, Housing & Food Service Rates

The tuition rates and mandatory student fees that were approved by the Board of Regents at its April meeting to be assessed at the University of Georgia during FY 2014 can be found at <a href="http://www.usg.edu/fiscal\_affairs/tuition\_and\_fees/">http://www.usg.edu/fiscal\_affairs/tuition\_and\_fees/</a>. Please note that the BOR staff has indicated that the housing and food services rates for FY 2014 will also be posted to this same link next week. These rates will be effective with the Fall 2013 semester.

Undergraduate in-state rates increased from \$3,823 to \$4,014 for students enrolled in more than six hours and from \$2,271 to \$2,385 for six hours or less. Out-of-state undergraduate rates increased from \$12,928 to \$13,119 for students enrolled in more than 6 hours and from \$7,671 to \$7,785 for 6 hours or less. (Please note that undergraduate students will pay a per credit hour rate during the Summer 2014 term of \$268 for in-state and \$875 for out-of-state students.) In-state graduate students will pay \$3,850 per semester (\$321 per credit hour for those enrolled in less than twelve hours per semester) while out-of-state graduate rates are \$11,500 and \$959, respectively. The tuition rates for students enrolled in professional programs that assess program specific tuition rates are detailed at the link above.

Please note that the Board of Regents also established a new mandatory ConnectUGA fee. This \$12 per semester fee is comprised of two components: 1) the \$6 that was added to the Student Technology Fee in FY 2012 dedicated exclusively to help finance UGA's efforts to modernize its student information systems, and 2) a \$6 per semester increase that was endorsed by the FY 2014 Mandatory Student Fee Advisory Committee to increase support for this initiative. As a result, the Student Technology Fee is being reduced from \$120 per

semester to \$114 per semester so that the net of these two actions on UGA's mandatory student fees is a \$6 per semester increase.
